## MUSIC FESTIVALS

Milton Keynes Theatre has been filled with the sound of music and singing over the past week as Milton Keynes Music Service held their annual series of concerts.

On Tuesday morning the WIDER OPPORTUNITIES FESTIVAL took place. This was an opportunity for all the children who have been learning a musical instrument to perform on the stage. We took along all our recorder, woodwind, brass and string players and they all took to the stage together to play a piece of music, Movie Buster, that all the groups had been practising with their respective music teachers over the last few weeks. They sounded FANTASTIC! After their performance the children remained on stage while all the other children who had previously performed joined them and then the entire ensemble played a piece of music entitled Milton Keynes Rock.

At the end of the morning we took all the children for a play in Campbell Park. We had been hoping to have a picnic lunch in the park, but unfortunately it looked like rain and it was just too chilly to eat outside, so we had our sandwiches in the foyer of the theatre (with the permission of the theatre staff!).

Then it was back into the auditorium for the RECORDER FESTIVAL. All the children were able to participate in this as not only was there recorder playing, but there were plenty of opportunities to use the vocal chords too.

On Wednesday morning the Queen Eleanor Orchestra performed their two pieces that they had played in the theatre the previous day to the rest of the school in assembly.

On Thursday morning it was back to the theatre but this time with Year 2 so that they could take part in the INFANT SCHOOL MUSIC FESTIVAL. They were able to sing the African songs they have been learning - and which you had the opportunity to hear at Midsummer Music - along with the children from many other schools in Milton Keynes. There were over 1,000 children all singing together at this event.

In the afternoon Years 4, 5 and 6 went to the theatre where they sang along with another 1,000 children from Milton Keynes schools in the JUNIOR SCHOOLS MUSIC FESTIVAL. Again this was an opportunity to sing the songs from Kofi's Journey that you will have heard at Midsummer Music.

But that wasn't the end of it.... On Thursday evening 21 children returned to the theatre for MILTON KEYNES MUSIC FESTIVAL.
